


Where Does Cargo Come From?

Cargo is the term we use for goods that arrive from across the world. In Victorian London, many cargo ships arrived into the docks around Tower Bridge.



Fact More tea is drunk around the world than any other drink


oranges

Fact There are over 600 varieties of oranges


coffee

Fact The world's Coffee Belt spans the globe along the equator


coal

Fact Coal has long been burned to create electricity and heat


wool

Fact Wool has been used to make human clothing since the Stone Age


rice

Fact The Great Wall of China is held together with rice


guano
